PRESENTATION

Dear participants,

We are pleased to welcome you to the *IV Latin American Legal Conference on Reproductive Rights*, a high level forum that, every two years, gathers academics, justice officials (judges, magistrates, prosecutors), legislators, activists specialized in strategic dispute resolution and incidence, professional colleges and civil society representatives involved in the defense and promotion of reproductive rights in the region from a perspective of human rights and comparative law.

The objectives of the IV Legal Conference are as follows: 1) Fostering dialogue among the judiciary, the academy and regional activism regarding the relevance of incorporating international standards for the protection of sexual and reproductive rights as human rights in court decisions; 2) Strengthening legal reasoning and judicial interpretation with a perspective on gender, public health and human rights to guarantee the validity of reproductive rights of women; 3) Identifying the main challenges and formal and structural barriers for the full exercise of reproductive rights, as well as effective strategies to overcome them; and 4) Creating collaboration links among the different parties involved in the defense, protection and guarantee of reproductive rights.

The subjects to be discussed this year will be framed in a long term and great relevance discussion for the Latin American region: **Intersections between violence against women and reproductive rights** with an insight from justice, equality of gender, human rights and democracy. This is a subject that poses judicial challenges, and the international community has evidenced its concern for the dramatic situation of many women as a result of restrictions on the free exercise of their sexuality and their reproductive capacities.

The IV Legal Conference will include and review several central themes: criminal law and reproductive rights; access to justice, including transnational justice, in the matter of reproductive rights; and the responsibilities of



the State regarding the right to be free of violence in the framework of reproductive rights. The leading theme and fundamental foundation of this conference is the understanding and treatment of reproductive rights as human rights and their protection mechanisms.

The **Association of Judges for Justice and Democracy - JUSDEM** and the **Andean Commission of Jurists - CAJ** as the host institutions of this IV Legal Congress, have the intention that dialogue shall be as enriching as possible.
